



Public Compliance Statement

As a charity currently seeking funding from the public, Breast Cancer Ireland aims to comply with the Guidelines for Charitable Organisations on Fundraising from the Public.

Breast Cancer Ireland is committed to complying with the Guidelines for Charitable Organisations on Fundraising from the Public and has formally discussed and adopted the Guidelines at a meeting of the governing body.

- Breast Cancer Ireland confirms its commitment to the principles set out in the Guidelines for Charitable Organisations on Fundraising from the Public by a statement to that effect in its annual report.
- Breast Cancer Ireland has a Donor Charter which is consistent with the Guidelines for Charitable Organisations on Fundraising from the Public.
- Breast Cancer Ireland regularly monitors compliance with the Guidelines for Charitable Organisations on Fundraising from the Public and compliance reports are received regularly by the governing body.
- Breast Cancer Ireland considers the Guidelines for Charitable Organisations on Fundraising from the Public when planning all fundraising activity.
- Breast Cancer Ireland has a policy on working with third party fundraisers (if applicable).
- Breast Cancer Ireland provides honest, open, accountable and transparent disclosure when fundraising from the public.
- Breast Cancer Ireland has appointed a member of the governing body and/or a senior member of staff to be responsible for compliance with the Guidelines for Charitable Organisations on Fundraising from the Public.
- Breast Cancer Ireland ensures that fundraising staff are provided with information and training on the Guidelines for Charitable Organisations on Fundraising from the Public and its implementation.
- Breast Cancer Ireland has a feedback and complaints procedure consistent with the Guidelines for Charitable Organisations on Fundraising from the Public. Feedback is recorded for review by relevant staff including the CEO and governing body. Feedback is responded to promptly and appropriately.
- Breast Cancer Ireland prepares financial reports consistent with the requirements of the Charities Act 2009 and the Charities Regulator which include a statement concerning the extent to which control of the organisation is independent of its funding sources.
- Breast Cancer Ireland ensures that all donations are tracked and recorded and complies with data protection requirements.
- Breast Cancer Ireland is accessible to the public through a number of readily available contact options.
